### 2.0 PURPOSE & EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

In 2012, staff developed the Academic program scorecard, with the first version of the scorecard being presented to the Board in November 2012. The scorecard is updated on an annual basis and provides the Board with an opportunity to review program performance data. The scorecard is also a tool that supports program lifecycle processes including: new program development, program review, program modifications and program suspensions.

**3.0 BACKGROUND:**

The program scorecard provides the following metrics for each program at the college:

## 5.0 DISCUSSION:

The populated scorecard is included in Appendix A: Program Scorecard.

There are several considerations that will be considered when assessing program scorecard data:

- Retention – in many areas, students will transfer amongst programs that are clustered. This will impact an individual program's retention and graduation rate but not the overall rate for the college. To that end, staff are working on a new retention report with standardized definitions and calculations. Once this is complete, the program scorecard retention metric will be updated to align with this initiative.
- Suspended Programs – Some programs listed as offered at the College are under intake suspension (programs that are not accepting new Semester one students but may still have students in other semesters). The intake suspension will impact negatively on some metrics (for example, admissions and enrolment).
- New Programs – New program offerings will typically have lower contribution margins due to the nature of the Ministry's two-year slip funding. Additionally, new programs will not have graduation and graduate employment rates as these calculations are considered over a time frame equal to twice the length of the program.
- Collaborative programs – programs that are offered in collaboration with other institutions may pose challenges for data collection and analysis.
- Part-time Students – The scorecard data reflect full time students and therefore tracking trends in programs with a significant number of part time students is challenging.

These qualitative considerations will be addressed by staff in each program area when analyzing the scorecard data and making decisions with respect to program review and/or program prioritization.

Report # A.14.02.200 - Program Prioritization update provides specific details on program prioritization activities that are currently underway to address programs with low metrics. Program prioritization activities will be supporting the 2014/15 budget process. Staff have completed data analysis and monitoring exercises. The academic team is currently focused on performing a qualitative analysis of each program that was deemed to be under review.

## 6.0 STUDENT IMPACT:

The program scorecard will ultimately benefit students by ensuring a continuous assessment of the performance of all programs, making adjustments when required.

**7.0 FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

One of the metrics included on the scorecard will be the financial performance of programs, as measured by contribution margins.

**8.0 HUMAN RESOURCES IMPACT:**

The scorecard will provide staff with the data needed to celebrate and improve program quality.
